

MINJECT

CATTLE & SHEEP FOR THE TREATMENT OF MILK FEVER AND MILK FEVER

Complicated by:

- HYPOMAGNESAEMIA - Grass Staggers, Grass Tetany or deficiency of Magnesium in the bloodstream
- HYPOPHOSPHATAEMIA - Deficiency of Phosphorous in the bloodstream
- ACETONAEMIA - Ketosis, Pregnancy Toxaemia or Deficiency of Sugar in the bloodstream

MILK FEVER & COMPLICATIONS

Symptoms:

- Loss of appetite
- Bloating
- Muscle weakness which may cause the cow to stagger and/or go down
- Reduction of parturient or post parturient uterine contractions

MINJECT

- The injection of Minject gives enough Calcium to cover 6 hours
- The administration of Cal-Jet Oral simultaneously, increases Calcium coverage to 24 hours

FAQ's

- Q. If I have a downer Cow that will not get up after I have injected with her with a dose of Minject 4in1, what should I do?
- A. Give her another injection of Minject 4in1 and when you get her on her feet, also give her an oral dose of Cal-Jet Oral. If she will not get up, call your vet.
