

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SAMPLING SHEEP, CATTLE AND HORSES FOR FEC

FEC Bulk Sampling

- 1. Before sampling write on the sample bags sample 1, 2 and 3 to correspond with the submission form.
- 2. Gather the stock into corner of the paddock or put into yards for a period of time allowing them to drop samples and then let stock move away.
- **3. Sheep:** Using the scoop provided, take 20-30 measured scoops (1 scoop per dung sample) putting them in the plastic bag provided.

Cattle: Using the scoop provided, take 3 measured scoops in a triangle shape from 10-15 pats putting them into the bag provided. This will give a bulk sample of 30-45 scoops.

Horses: This is an individual animal test. Use the same method as for cattle except turn the sample bag inside out and take three grabbed samples in a triangle from the dung and pull the bag through back on itself.

- 4. Expel all of the air out of the bag and seal. **This is very important.**
- 5. If testing different classes of stock take a separate sample for each class. Also, if testing large mobs allow for two or more samples to get a more accurate count.
- 6. Place all samples into the plastic container provided and place into the courier bag provided.
- 7. Fill out the submission form and place in the courier bag.
- 8. If unable to send that day place the samples in the fridge, not the freezer, and send the next day.
- 9. PLEASE DO NOT SEND SAMPLES ON A FRIDAY!! This will mean the samples will be left in the courier base for the weekend which will compromise the results.
- 10. Do not leave samples in the sun or a high temperature area.
